Dismissal

On this night Christians commemorate the supper Jesus shared with his disciples before his crucifixion, when Jesus washed the disciples' feet and instituted the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. The ancient practice of stripping the Lord's table and sanctuary following communion is a vivid and dramatic way of showing the desolation and abandonment of the long night in Gethsemane and what followed.

A Service of Tenebrae, or "Darkness" is based on a twelfth-century late night/early morning service and is an extended meditation of the passion of Christ. Fourteen candles, along with a central Christ candle, are lighted; then one is extinguished at the conclusion of each section.

A cymbal crash is used to represent the stone closing over the tomb, and the lit Christ candle returns as a symbol of our hope in the resurrected Christ.
